The Deviants of Athens through the Positivist Perspective

Faculty Advisor: Dr. Joanne Murphy

- Critically analyzed ancient texts from Classical Athens to understand what actions and individuals were considered unconventional and how Classical Athenians claimed to treat these deviants in death
- Examined burial monuments devoted to Greek athletes and warriors, child remains within the Athenian agora, well burials, and analyses of bone fractures
- Applied the Positivist Perspective to reveal a cohesive understanding of deviancy among ancient Greeks, despite the inconsistencies between who they claimed were deviant and who actually was through their burial practices
